AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH LIRO GIS, INC., D/B/A LIRO-HILL, FOR UPDATING TAX MAP INFORMATION AND STREAMLINING PROCESSES

WHEREAS, the current ESRI software, ArcMap, which is used by the Real Property Tax Service Agency to maintain municipal Geographic Information Systems (GIS) tax maps and files, will be retired in March 2026; and

WHEREAS, competitive proposals were solicited to provide GIS conversion services (24-RFP-RPGCS-1); and

WHEREAS, LiRo GIS, Inc., d/b/a LiRo-Hill, is a Silver-Tier ESRI business partner that supports ESRI GIS solutions, as well as provides conversion services, technical support, and training; and

WHEREAS, LiRo-Hill is one of the largest GIS Consulting and Implementation firms in the Northeast, with over 40 years of experience providing government organizations with a broad range of Information Technology Solutions; and

WHEREAS, LiRo-Hill has created GIS and tax mapping solutions of varying complexity for clients at all levels of state and local government; and

WHEREAS, our Director of Real Property and the Real Property Committee have recommended that the County enter into an agreement with LiRo GIS, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$39,432.82, as well as any necessary change orders not to exceed an additional \$3,943.28; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 46-2016, this Board authorized the Saratoga County Department of Social Services (DSS) to accept a five (5) year Safe Harbour: NY grant in the amount of \$483,600 from the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) to cultivate increased human trafficking awareness and implement a more effective and efficient approach for youth in need within existing child welfare and critical youth-serving programs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 323-2021, this Board authorized a renewal agreement with the Saratoga Center for the Family, Inc. for their continued coordination of the Safe Harbour: NY Program in Saratoga County, as well as to assist in the development of a critical services team within the County to meet the needs of youth that are identified as victims of labor and/or sex trafficking, for the term January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 368-2022, this Board authorized a renewal agreement with the Saratoga Center for the Family, Inc. for their continued coordination of the Safe Harbour: NY Program in Saratoga County, as well as to assist in the development of a critical services team within the County to meet the needs of youth that are identified as victims of labor and/or sex trafficking, for the term January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, NYS OCFS has allocated \$35,000 for Saratoga County to continue the Safe Harbour: NY Program in 2024 for the specific purpose of meeting the needs of sexually exploited children through age 21; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of these OCFS grant funds requires the Board's approval and an amendment to the 2024 Saratoga County Budget; now, therefore, be it

AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH CARVER CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR CONSTRUCTION SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH THE REPLACEMENT OF THE COUNTY ROUTE 24 CULVERT OVER A TRIBUTARY TO THE HUDSON RIVER IN THE TOWN OF CORINTH AND AMENDING THE 2024 BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, a project for the BRIDGE NY Culvert LIN 332.10, CR 24 over Hudson River Tributary Replacement, P.I.N. 1762.06 (the "Project"), is eligible for reimbursement of qualified costs from BRIDGE NY funding that calls for the post-reimbursement apportionment of the qualified costs to be borne at the ratio of 100% BRIDGE NY funds and 0% non-BRIDGE NY funds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 115-2022, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors authorized the County of Saratoga to pay 100% of the costs of design, ROW Incidentals and Acquisition, and construction services/construction inspection work for the Project or portions thereof, with the understanding that qualified costs will be reimbursed from BRIDGE NY funding; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 115-2022, the sum of \$697,600 was previously appropriated from the County's Highway Fund and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phases of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the lowest bid for construction services associated with the replacement of the County Route 24 culvert over a tributary to the Hudson River in the Town of Corinth was submitted by Carver Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$981,145; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 115-2022, \$697,600 of the previously appropriated Highway Funds were designated to cover the cost of construction services associated with the replacement of the County Route 24 culvert over a tributary to the Hudson River in the Town of Corinth; and

WHEREAS, the sum of \$283,545 will need to be transferred from the General Fund (D.50.5031) to the Contracted Highway Services Fund (D.50.510-7502) to cover the difference between the initial estimated cost of construction and the revised cost of construction; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Committee and the Commissioner of Public Works recommend that the Board of Supervisors empower the Chair of the Board and execute a

contract with Carver Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$981,145 for construction services associated with the replacement of the County Route 24 culvert over the tributary to the Hudson River in the Town of Corinth and authorize the amending of the budget in relation thereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 115-2022, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors agreed that the County of Saratoga shall be responsible for all costs of the Project, including costs which exceed the amount of reimbursement available from the NY BRIDGE funding awarded to the County of Saratoga; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 115-2022, the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors agreed that in a circumstance where the cost of the Project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the County Board of Supervisors shall promptly convene to appropriate the excess amount immediately upon notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Carver Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$981,145 for construction services associated with the replacement of the County Route 24 culvert over the tributary to the Hudson River in the Town of Corinth; and be it further

RESOLVED, the form and content of the agreement with Carver Construction, Inc. shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and be it further

WHEREAS, the Public Works Committee and the Commissioner of Public Works recommend that the Board empower the Chairman of the Board to execute all necessary paperwork needed to accept any and all grant funds offered by the FAA in response to the application seeking to obtain FY-2024 Funding for construction costs related to the rehabilitation of the western itinerant apron at the Saratoga County Airport up to the sum of \$500,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to County Law §450(3)(d) the Board of Supervisors are authorized to delegate to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors the power to execute and deliver documents and contracts authorized by such Board; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, following a public hearing held on July 13, 2022, the Board of Supervisors determined, pursuant to Resolution 251 - 2022 adopted July 19, 2022, that it is in the public interest of the people of the County of Saratoga residing within the boundaries of the District to undertake the Project at a maximum estimated cost of \$44,469,202, with the annual net cost to the typical property in the District as a result of the Project previously estimated to be \$8.00; and

WHEREAS, following a public hearing held on June 12, 2024, the Board of Supervisors subsequently determined, pursuant to Resolution 163-2024 adopted June 18, 2024, that it is in the public interest of the people of the County of Saratoga residing within the boundaries of the District to undertake the Project at an increased maximum estimated cost of \$48,228,452, at a revised annual net cost to the typical property in the District of \$11.63; and

WHEREAS, the estimated maximum cost of the Project has increased from \$48,228,452 to \$52,628,452; and

WHEREAS, the County's Negotiating Committee, the County's Director of Human Resources, and the County's Labor Counsel have recommended that all Memoranda of Agreement be incorporated into the Collective Bargaining Agreement through December 31, 2028, and the Collective Bargaining Agreement be executed; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the terms of the June 18, 2024 Memorandum of Agreement with the CSEA and that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to execute the Collective Bargaining Agreement with the CSEA, to include the terms of all Memoranda of Agreement; subject only to final agreement on, and the approval of, its language in final form by this County's Negotiating Committee and the County's Labor Counsel; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such amended Collective Bargaining Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the 2024 Compensation Schedule be updated to reflect the salary

changes in the June 18, 2024, Memorandum of Agreement; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Budget Director is authorized to make any necessary interdepartmental budget transfers to account for the additional cost associated with the contract; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

<u>BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT:</u> No budget impact. Funds are included in the 2024 County budget.

CSEA Memorandum of Agreement – Proposed New Contract Terms

The County's negotiating team reached a tentative agreement with the CSEA on June 18th for a five-year contract covering January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2028. The agreement outlines several updates and changes to the existing collective bargaining agreement. Here are the key points:

1. Recognition: New sections added, requiring the County to provide new employee information to CSEA and allow CSEA to meet with new employees for orientation.

2. Wage Increases: The new Agreement will be effective from the signing date through 2028, including a \$4,000 increase at signing (note: a \$4,000 flat-rate increase represents an average 7.3% wage increase based on the average CSEA bargaining unit salary of \$54,565) and a 2.95% annual wage increase in each year from 2025 to 2028. Retroactive payments will be made for employees on payroll from January 1, 2024 in a lump sum - \$153.85 per pay period that the employee was on the payroll from January 1, 2024 until the signing of the Agreement.

3. Work Day and Work Week: Changes apply only to the Sewer District – no other departments affected. These changes define the work week as Monday through Friday (as opposed to a generic "five days") and eliminate third shift maintenance.

4. Compensatory Time: New language allows for an automatic rollover of 40 hours of comp time, to be used in the next calendar year, with the County retaining the right to buy out comp time in excess of 40 hours with notice by November 1st each year.

5. Meal Allowance: Increased from \$10 to \$20 effective as of the date of signing (not retroactive).

6. On-Call Compensation: Proposed changes to the negotiated on-call language would introduce a standardized process for employees in Social Services, Department of Health, and Mental Health who are required to be on call (note: Sewer District on-call language is not affected by these proposed changes). Employees will be paid set rates for being on-call (otherwise known as "inconvenience pay") – three times the employee's hourly rate for Mondays through Thursdays, four times the employee's hourly rate for Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, and seven times the employee's hourly rate for all holidays. Employees are compensated, either in pay or compensatory time, for all time actually worked while on-call.

7. Health Insurance Premium Contributions: Gradual increase in employee contributions toward health and dental premiums based on hire date

- 20% contributors remain at 20% for the life of the new contract
- 15% contributors increase to 16% effective 1/1/2026, 18% effective 1/1/2027, and 20% effective 1/1/2028
- 5% contributors increase to 6% effective 1/1/2026, 8% effective 1/1/2027, and 10% effective 1/1/2028

8. Health Insurance Co-pays: Increased co-pays for office visits, specialist visits, emergency room visits, and prescriptions, effective January 1, 2025, pursuant to the following schedule:

<u>Note</u>: The co-pays listed are based on in-network services. Out-of-network services are subject to the employee's deductible and then coinsurance charges (refer to plan summaries for more details).

9. Holiday: Addition of Juneteenth as an additional paid holiday and enhanced stipulations for holiday pay eligibility. Specifically, new proposed language would allow managerial discretion in requesting a medical note for employees who call out sick on the day preceding or following a paid holiday.

10. Vacation: Modifications to carryover policies - vacation time will roll over automatically without the need for the employee to complete a request form. An updated vacation entitlement schedule based on years of service to extend an additional day per year of service for years 4 through 11:

The proposed language also stipulates that newly hired employees will not be paid for unused vacation until completing one year of employment.

11. Sick Leave: Allows employees to use up to 60 days annually of accrued sick leave for family illness (currently 1/3 of available sick time).

12. Bereavement Leave: Expands the definition of "Immediate Family" to include step-brother, step-sister and grandchild.

13. Grievance Procedure: Detailed grievance process, including definitions, stages of grievance handling, and arbitration procedures.

14. Discipline and Discharge: Revised procedures for disciplinary actions, appeal processes, and timelines for employees, including access to arbitration.

15. Miscellaneous: Removal of "beepers" from the agreement, clarification on vehicle maintenance reviews, and updates to departmental references. Also removed is the contractual obligation of members to inform management of pregnancy status.

The agreement includes other minor adjustments and administrative changes aimed at clarifying terms and aligning with current practices and legal requirements.
