AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND DISBURSEMENT OF NEW YORK STATE SEPTIC SYSTEM REPLACEMENT PROGRAM GRANT FUNDS, AND AMENDING THE 2024 COUNTY BUDGET IN RELATION THERETO

WHEREAS, the New York State Clean Water Infrastructure Act of 2017 established the Septic System Replacement Fund ("the Fund") to provide property owners a source of funding for the replacement of failing cesspools and septic systems servicing residences and small businesses in New York State; and

WHEREAS, the Septic System Replacement Program ("the Program") is a grant program that seeks to reduce the environmental and public health impacts associated with the discharge of effluent from cesspools and septic systems on groundwater used as drinking water, as well as threatened or impaired waterbodies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 45-2023, this board authorized the County to participate in the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation ("EFC") Septic System Replacement Program ("the Program") for the term January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2026, and authorized the execution of a County Participation Agreement with the EFC; and

WHEREAS, the Program is being administered for the County by the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District; and

WHEREAS, two property owners in the Town of Clifton Park submitted grant applications to the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District requesting an award of Program funds for the replacement of the aging septic system on their properties; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District determined that said proposed septic system projects would significantly and quantifiably reduce potential environmental and/or public health impacts that could result from the aging septic systems, and issued an award letter to the applicants notifying them of the award of Program funds for the reimbursement of their eligible project costs; and

WHEREAS, the property owners have completed their septic system replacement projects, and have applied to the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District for the disbursement of their grant award of Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the Saratoga County Soil and Water Conservation District made an application to the EFC for disbursement of the Septic System Replacement Program funds awarded for these septic system projects, and EFC has distributed total funds in the amount of \$16,492 to the County in reimbursement of the eligible costs of said projects; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance and disbursement of these Septic System Replacement Program grant funds requires this Board's approval, and an amendment to the 2024 Saratoga County Budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents and agreements with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation for the acceptance of Septic System Replacement Program grant funds in the amount of \$14,433.75; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the form and content of such documents and agreements are subject to the approval of the County Attorney; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the 2024 Saratoga County Budget is hereby amended as follows:

State Septic System Replacement Program

Program Summary

The Clean Water Infrastructure Act of 2017 (L. 2017, c. 57, Part T) established the Septic System Replacement Fund to provide a source of funding for the replacement of cesspools and septic systems in New York State. This grant program (the "Program") seeks to reduce the environmental and public-health impacts associated with the discharge of effluent from cesspools and septic systems on groundwater used as drinking water, as well as threatened or impaired waterbodies.

The state Department of Environmental Conservation ("DEC") and the state Department of Health ("DOH") have determined priority geographic areas where the Program will provide grants for eligible septic system projects. An area's designation as a priority is based on its vulnerability to contamination (e.g. the presence of a sole-source aquifer, or a known water-quality impairment), population density, soils, hydrogeology, climate, and reasonable ability for septic system projects to mitigate water quality impacts. Under the Program, counties in which priority geographic areas are located can access monies from the Fund to provide grants to reimburse property owners for up to 50% of the eligible costs (up to a maximum of \$10,000) of their eligible septic system projects.

The Program provides grants for eligible "septic system projects" involving:

- the replacement of a cesspool with a septic system, or
- the installation, replacement or upgrade of a septic system or septic system components, or installation of enhanced treatment technologies, including an advanced nitrogen removal system.

Overview

DEC and DOH have identified priority geographic areas for the replacement of septic systems, and allocated funding to counties from the Fund. Counties that have priority areas within their boundaries, and choose to participate in this program, are called "Participating Counties."

Participating Counties notify owners of property served by septic systems (including residences and small businesses) that they could be eligible for financial assistance from the Septic System Replacement Program. Once notified, property owners who undertake a septic system project may apply to the Participating County for a grant from the Program.

Participating Counties review and evaluate the applications and determine financial assistance awards based on the Program criteria and consideration of a property's location in relation to a waterbody, impacts to groundwater used as drinking water, and the condition of the property owner's current septic system. Participating Counties may set graduated incentive reimbursement rates for septic system projects to maximize

pollution reduction outcomes. Septic system projects located in a priority geographic area identified by DEC as threatened or impaired by nitrogen must reduce nitrogen levels by at least 30% to receive assistance.

After evaluating applications and making funding decisions, Participating Counties notify the property owners of their grant awards by sending them award letters that include the amount, and other terms and conditions, of the grant. Property owners must formally accept the grant award and its terms and conditions by signing and returning the letter to their participating counties, after which property owners may proceed and hire design professionals and contractors to complete the work on their septic system projects.

As the Program provides funding on a reimbursement basis, property owners are initially responsible for the total cost of their septic system projects. Property owners may also choose to have the reimbursement paid directly to their contractors, which could reduce their out-of-pocket costs.

To receive reimbursement, property owners submit a reimbursement request to the Participating County in which they are located upon completion of their septic system projects. Reimbursement requests must include:

- (i) the completed Reimbursement Request form;
- (ii) any applicable design approval for the septic system project;
- (iii) description of all work completed;
- (iv) cost documentation and invoice or invoices for eligible costs; and
- (v) if applicable, a written authorization for a septic system contractor directly to receive the property owner's reimbursement.

Participating Counties review the reimbursement requests, and approve, adjust or deny them, as appropriate. No more often than once a month, Participating Counties aggregate the reimbursement requests they've received, and certify that amount in a disbursement request to the Environmental Facilities Corporation ("EFC"), which administers the Septic System Replacement Fund. EFC reviews the disbursement requests and once it is confirmed that all necessary documentation has been received and verified, disburses monies from the fund to the participating counties, which then issue reimbursement payments to property owners or their contractors for their completed septic system projects.



This clause shall not be construed to limit, or otherwise impair, other rights or obligations of indemnity which exist in law or equity for the COUNTY's benefit.
- 8. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with proof of professional liability insurance issued by a company authorized by license to do business in the State of New York. The policy's minimum coverage shall be \$1,000,000/single incident. The CONTRACTOR may utilize umbrella/excess coverage to achieve the limits required hereunder. The certificate holder must be listed as the COUNTY OF SARATOGA, 40 McMaster Street, Ballston Spa, New York 12020. This insurance certificate must also name the COUNTY OF SARATOGA as additional insured and the CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with proof of such insurance in the form of an Additional Insured Endorsement Rider or other proof acceptable to COUNTY.
- 9. WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE REQUIREMENT: This Agreement shall be void and of no effect unless throughout the term of this Agreement CONTRACTOR, in compliance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Law, shall secure compensation for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this Agreement, such employees as are required to be insured according to law. Proof of such Workers' Compensation Insurance coverage shall be provided to the COUNTY.
- 10. <u>INSURANCE CANCELLATION NOTICE</u>: In the event that CONTRACTOR receives notice of cancellation any insurance policy carried pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall immediately provide the COUNTY with written notice of such cancellation by no later than the next business day of the COUNTY. In the event of such insurance policy cancellation, CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with proof of equivalent policy and limit replacement insurance satisfying the insurance requirements herein within two (2) COUNTY business days of the CONTRACTOR's receipt of notice of cancellation of insurance. Any failure by CONTRACTOR to comply with the insurance requirements of this Agreement in a timely manner shall constitute a breach of this Agreement, and the COUNTY may, at its option, terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the CONTRACTOR.

- 11. <u>DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION</u>: The CONTRACTOR waives any right to bring action against the COUNTY for any damage to the property of the CONTRACTOR arising out of the alleged negligence of the COUNTY, its agents, servants and employees. The CONTRACTOR agrees that any policy of insurance insuring its property, shall contain a waiver of subrogation rights for any property loss suffered by reason of the alleged negligence or other unlawful act by COUNTY, its agents, servants and employees.
 - 12. REPORTS: Intentionally Omitted.
- 13. <u>MODIFICATION</u>: This Agreement constitutes the complete understanding of the parties. No modification of any provision thereof shall be valid unless in writing signed by both parties.
- 14. <u>ASSIGNMENT AND TRANSFER</u>: The CONTRACTOR shall not assign or transfer any interest herein without the COUNTY's prior written consent. All of the terms, covenants and agreements herein contained shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto.
- 15. <u>DEFAULT</u>: The occurrence of any of the following shall be considered an Event of Default:
 - a. Non-Payment: The failure by the COUNTY to make any of the payments required pursuant to this Agreement when due.
 - b. <u>Failure to Perform</u>: The failure of the CONTRACTOR to perform the Services outlined in Section 2 of this Agreement.
 - c. Other Failure to Perform: The failure by either COUNTY or CONTRACTOR to perform and/or comply with any term, covenant, or condition required under this Agreement.
- 16. <u>REMEDIES</u>: In the Event of Default under this Agreement, the non-defaulting party may take such legal action as may be appropriate under the circumstances, including injunctive relief, declaratory judgment, or monetary damages for such default. No such action or proceeding shall be commenced until the defaulting party has been given written notice thereof by the non-defaulting party and thirty (30) days have elapsed since receipt of such notice, and the defaulting party has not proceeded to cure the default. Any default by a party in providing the insurance required pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the remedies and requirements set forth in Section 7 herein.
- 17. <u>TERMINATION</u>: Termination for cause brought about by failure of the CONTRACTOR to perform shall be effected only if the CONTRACTOR fails to remedy or eliminate the violation within twenty (20) days of written notification thereof from the COUNTY. Termination without cause may be effectuated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.

Scope of Representation

Attorney Gina Middleton and I will be the responsible attorneys in this matter. Other lawyers and paralegals in the firm may, from time to time, be involved as well.

Billing Basis

Unless we agree otherwise, payment will be due upon receipt of our bill. If you have questions about our billing rate or method, please feel free to discuss this early in our representation.

Billing Rates

The legal services rendered to the County in this matter will be based on a rate of \$295.00 per hour for partners, \$250.00 per hour for special counsel and of counsel, \$225.00 per hour for associates, and \$165.00 per hour for the time of paralegals. These rates may be modified over

time, but we will, of course, inform you immediately if our rates should increase. Our statements will reflect the rates in effect at the time of billing. Statements for legal services and expenses will be forwarded to you on a monthly basis, unless you prefer otherwise.

Training

During our meeting, we discussed the opportunity to provide training to County staff with regard to FOIL requests. We would be happy to provide such training upon request. Gina and I are willing to provide in-person training for a discounted flat fee of \$2,000.00 in total. If you prefer to have the training via a remote meeting, we would charge only \$1,000.00 for such training.

In the unlikely event that a fee dispute arises, and you notify us of the County's intention to arbitrate, at your request, we will provide them with the appropriate forms to file to implement the right to arbitrate.

Travel Time

In the event any travel is required on behalf of the County, such time will normally be charged at the hourly rate. However, there may be occasion that we will charge a reduced rate for travel time, if agreed by both parties in advance.

Efforts on Your Behalf

We will strive to complete the work as expeditiously as possible and at a fair and reasonable cost to the County. We do represent other clients, and there will be times when we will be giving the County's work priority over others.

Termination

You shall at all times have the right to terminate our services upon written notice to that effect. We shall, subject to applicable court requirements with respect to withdrawal, have the right to terminate our services upon reasonable written notice.

If you have any questions about these terms, please let me know. Otherwise, if they are acceptable to you, I would appreciate you signing a copy of this agreement, and sending it back to me via email or US Mail.
